Allen S. Rosen, age 93, of Cincinnati died Sunday November 17, 2019 at the Fairfield Pavilion where he had been living for the past three years. He was born January 17, 1926 in Cincinnati to Oscar Rosen and Bertha (Chaliff) Fisher.

Growing up amongst a large extended family in Price Hill, Allen was close to many aunts, uncles and cousins who became a major part of his life-long inner-circle. Thanks to the University of Cincinnati's co-op program, he became one of the first in his family to graduate from college, earning a degree in business in 1949. This education was useful when he then joined the army, as his writing and math skills earned him immediate promotion to company clerk, effectively keeping him safe behind the front lines of the Korean War.

Allen's Price Hill connections paid off when Charlotte Schultz, a smart and sweet neighborhood girl caught his attention, then his heart. They were married in 1954 and raised two sons, Steven and Barry, until Charlotte's death in 1970.

Allen operated Moore's Jewelers for nearly four decades, first at Peebles Corner and then in Hyde Park and Montgomery. He became a certified gemologist and truly enjoyed getting to know his customers and participating

in their life celebrations.

But where he really shined was as a son, father, grandfather, and friend. He was gentle, thoughtful and always present for the people in his life. And his fun sense of humor was well-known and appreciated by all.

Allen was preceded in death by his parents, his wife Charlotte and son Steven. He is survived by his son Barry (Lisa) Rosen of Toledo, grandsons Stevie and Benny Rosen, sister Nancy Hodgson of Dallas, longtime companion Leah Cohen, and special relatives Alan Wolpa and Bess Wolf.
