A resident of Towson, Maryland, Carl Steiner attended Cincinnati Country Day School, Governor Dummer Academy in Massachusetts, and graduated from Boston University.

Carl was a passionate, high-level competitive chess player, who outflanked many opponents through studying of out-of-print chess books and mastering moves not commonly used by today's players. Carl's music library and tastes were diverse. He learned classical guitar to be able to play the pavaues of his favorite composer, Gasper Sanz (17th century.) Carl was an avid sports fan. He developed a love of ice hockey while at Boston University, and each year looked forward to the start of the hockey season on television.

Carl was kind, courageous, compassionate. A true gentleman. Carl had a mental rolodex of quotes, which he judiciously curated to punctuate his conversations with family and friends. He practiced meditation.
