



## Carmon Altman

March 30, 1934 - November 12, 2024

Carmon Altman, 90, passed away peacefully at her Cincinnati home on November 12, 2024, surrounded by family. Carmon was a wonderful mother, grandmother, great grandmother, and wife whose independence, determination, candor, and humor touched everyone who knew her. Even in her later years when her health was failing, she brought joy to everyone she met.

Born March 30, 1934, to Raymond V. and Ida Lou (Puckett) Condor in Commerce, TX. She was raised by her grandparents, Newton O., and Susan Emma (Warwick) Puckett in Leesburg, TX. She attended school in Pittsburg, TX and graduated from Pittsburg High School with the class of 1951.

She married Robert E. Lee (Mack) McManigell in Jackson, MS on October 15, 1954, and enjoyed 58 years of marriage until Mack's passing on January 1, 2013. Carmon and Mack had five children, Robert L. (Gloria) McManigell of Decatur, IL, Lesa Michelle (Rich) Vale of Monterrey, CA, Nina Marie Reynolds of Decatur, IL, Rose Lynn (Jim) Harris of Venice, FL, and Michael S. (Glenna) McManigell who preceded her in death. After Mack's death, Carmon married Sam Altman in August of 2013 and moved to Ocala, FL, until Sam's death on April 5, 2023. Carmon relocated to Cincinnati, OH.

She worked at General Electric in Decatur, IL and was co-owner of Mack's Motors before retiring and moving to Inverness, FL in 1981. Carmon was also a dedicated member of Temple Beth Shalom in Ocala, FL.

A private graveside service will take place at Forest Lawn Memory Gardens, 8740 S. Pine Ave. Ocala, FL on Thursday, December 19 at 10:30AM.
