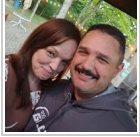

“ Christopher Hugh Adams, a son, brother, father and patriot who proudly served his nation, left his family and friends much too soon on Wednesday, Feb. 3, 2021, in Cincinnati, Ohio.

The longtime resident of Loveland, a northside suburb of Cincy, was 56 years old at the time of his passing.

Chris was born Dec. 7, 1964, in Lafayette, Tenn., a farming community just northeast of Nashville. His parents, Tommy Adams and Dixie (Hoskins-Adams) Pierce, both predeceased him.

Chris and his siblings, Tony, Jeff and Rebecca, had an upbringing that was very nomadic, with their construction foreman father working for a Memphis, Tenn., based company responsible for helping to convert the old-style party telephone lines to private lines. That meant plenty of moves to new homes and schools in west Tennessee, Arkansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina.

As the family finally began to settle down with their father's telephone industry career, which included another stop in Indiana, Chris finished growing up in the central Kentucky farming community of Munfordville, graduating from Hart County High School.

His career path then took him into the U.S. Army, where he decided to enter the field of aircraft repair, enlisting and initially working on military helicopters, which included a stint in the Middle East. After leaving the service, he earned his certification for the mechanical maintenance and repair of larger aircraft, which led him to jobs in the Cincinnati and Dayton area and those cities' large airports.

As for his personal interests, Chris was an avid motorcyclist, enjoying rides far and wide aboard his Harley-Davidsons. The weather couldn't stop him, with Chris occasionally riding to work and back aboard the two-wheelers in frigid temperatures. But most of all,

Chris was a very proud father of his daughter, Christina, and three sons, Zeb, Zarek and Zeke, whom he loved with all his heart.

A one-time Baptist, Chris converted to the Jewish faith many years ago. His graveside funeral is Wednesday, Feb. 10, at United Jewish Cemetery Loveland. Weil Kahn Funeral Home of Cincinnati handled the services.
