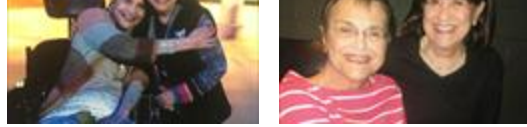
I missed seeing and being with Debi since they closed visiting of residents for three years even though we did talk on the phone but it wasn't the same since we couldn't be together.
