LEVINE, E. Pike 89, longtime resident of Cincinnati, passed away September 6, 2012 with his family by his side. He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Beverly Friedman Levine of Cincinnati; his three children: Iris Pastor (Steven) of Tampa, Florida; Steven Levine (Karen) of Cincinnati; and Lori Luckman (Jeff) of Newport News, Virginia; and his brother, Arnold Levine (Doreen), of Detroit, Michigan. He is also survived by eight grandchildren: Harry Cohen, Frank Cohen (Julie), Max Pastor (Jenny), Sam Pastor, Lou Pastor, Suzanne Luckman, Courtney Luckman and Rick DeLong; seven great-grandchildren: Sophie, Charlie, and Lucy Cohen, and Benjamin and Bobbie Pastor, and Desca and Dallas DeLong, numerous nieces, nephews, and friends. He was predeceased by his parents, Harry and Ida Levine, his brother, Daubert Levine, and his sister, Melva Case. Pike, a native of Utica, New York, served in World War II in the 8th Army Air Corps, 452nd Bomb Group. He was a ball turret gunner on a B-17 Flying Fortress. After the war, Pike founded and was president of American Research and Appraisal Company and made his living as an appraiser specializing in commercial and industrial real estate, machinery and equipment, and eminent domain issues and disputes. He also appeared as an expert witness in a large number of cases. Pike worked on such projects as the aftermath of the city of Xenia tornado, and was instrumental in setting the fair market value for the land that would later become I-71, I-75, Norwood Lateral and Cross County Highway, as well as being responsible for helping to preserve many local historical sites.
