Edward Hattenbach, 75, passed away on January 14, 2021, in Cincinnati, OH. He was born on May 29, 1945 in Cincinnati, OH, to Arthur Hattenbach and Hannah Hattenbach (nee Heyman). Edward graduated from Woodward High School and went on to earn a BBA from the University of Cincinnati and an MBA from Xavier University. Edward worked for many years as an accountant for Eagle Savings Bank and later Carpetland. He then earned his CPA certificate and operated his accounting practice in Anderson Township for over 20 years.

Edward married Shelley Hattenbach (nee Wallack) in Cincinnati on December 19, 1970. The couple had 2 children, Brian Hattenbach and Meryl Hattenbach.

Edward was active in the Jewish community and served in various volunteer roles at the Jewish Community Center and Adath Israel Congregation. He was also a proud member of the Amberley Village community and was serving his sixth term on Amberley Village Council when he passed.

Edward also served his country in the United States Army during the Vietnam War and was awarded the Bronze Star.

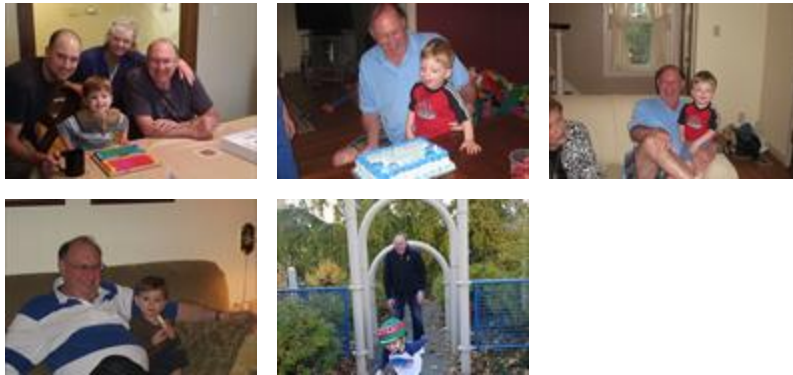
