



## Edward Wertheimer III

Edward Wertheimer III passed away peacefully in his home surrounded by loved ones on October 3rd, 2023, from ocular melanoma. He was just two weeks shy of his 90th birthday. Eppy (as he was known), loved his family, Cincinnati sports and Skyline chili. Everyone who was lucky enough to know Eppy adored him, and he made a lasting impression on so many people young and old. He was admired for his sense of humor and bad jokes, gentle, fun-loving nature, athleticism, generosity, and his full head of magnificent silver hair.

Eppy attended Miami University, and after, spent two years in the U.S. Army. He then joined his father in the family bourbon business.
