However, there was one thing Jacob and I had in common from the start; a passion for baseball. When the first spring of my freshman year finally arrived, so did my first baseball season at Seven Hills. From the very first practice, I knew immediately that Jacob was the upperclassman I wanted to follow. He had an unparalleled work ethic, focus, and determination to not only make himself better, but the entire team. I was lucky enough to come into high school as a catcher, and boy was it fun to have Jacob on the pitcher's mound. In the early preseason bullpen sessions, I marveled at his miraculous, air-bending curve ball. With ease, the baseball would zip towards the top corner of the strike-zone, but somehow find it's way down to my glove, far bellow a hitter's knees. It was virtually impossible for any batter to square-up that nasty, nasty pitch. When my sophomore season began, it was Jacob's senior season, and by this point it was his team. Jacob gave me the confidence to invest my heart and mind into the game of baseball, and he gave all of us the template for being the best version of ourselves, and for that I will always be grateful.
