Cincinnati-Surrounded by his loving and doting family, Malcolm (Mal) Coleman, age 92, passed away on November 19, 2018 after an extended illness. Mal was the devoted husband of the late Adell Coleman and enjoyed a fairy tale marriage with her for 60 years.
