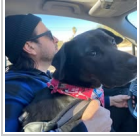

“ I had the absolute pleasure of having Marcus as a student in Spanish 202 in spring 2021. You can imagine the general level of fatigue we all felt – students and teachers alike! – after a full year of online classes and pandemic uncertainty. Nevertheless, Marcus was consistently the first student to join the class, always active and engaged, unfailingly enthusiastic when it came to sharing his thoughts and experiences.

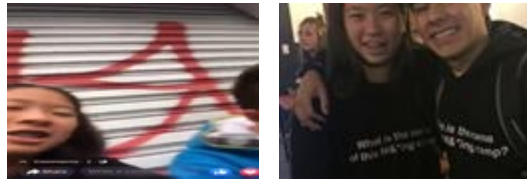
