February 16, 1925 - February 20, 2021

Martin Zimov passed away peacefully surrounded by loved ones on February 20th in Louisville, Kentucky just days after celebrating his 96th birthday. Marty grew up in the Price Hill section of Cincinnati, Ohio. He was a graduate of Western Hills High School where he earned 12 athletic letters and was a star quarterback on the football team. Marty was a World War II veteran, serving in Belgium and Germany. At the conclusion of the war, he guarded the Eagle's Nest. He returned home to study and graduate from The University of Cincinnati with a degree in Business Administration. He founded and was president of Insurance Brokerage Corporation of America for over 40 years. During his retirement, Marty volunteered for 9 years at Cedar Village Senior Living in Cincinnati and at Jewish Hospital East in Louisville Kentucky for 7 years. Marty received The Honored Volunteer Award in 2012 in conjunction with the WLKY-TV Bell awards. He retired from volunteer work at the age of 90. He was a former member of Golf Manor Synagogue in Cincinnati and later a member of The Temple in Louisville.

Marty was preceded in death by his wife of 58 years, Jean Adler Zimov and by his parents, Rose and Ben Zimov, and by his two older brothers, Sydney and Louis Zimov, and by a niece. He is survived by his two daughters, Sharon (Bob) Allen of Louisville, and Barbara (Steve) Hadley of Florida; by his 5

grandchildren: Diane (Reed) Weinberg of Louisville, Lori (Ryan) Karaian of Atlanta, Todd (Nicole) Hadley, Jonathan Hadley, and Bryan (Katherine) Hadley; and by 6 great grandchildren: Audrey and Eliza Weinberg, Sydney and Leah Karaian, Hazel Hadley, and Miles Hadley. He is also survived by several nephews and a niece.
