



Marvin H. Schwartz

October 2, 1932 - March 28, 2022

Marvin H. Schwartz passed away peacefully on March 28, 2022 at the age of 89. He was the son of the late Edith H. Lapirow and Dr. Bernard A. Schwartz.

Born October 2, 1932 in Cincinnati, he graduated from The Cincinnati Country Day School and Brown University. He was a United States Air Force jet fighter pilot, flying F86D's with the 85th Fighter Interceptor Squadron "The Globe's Greatest" retiring as a Captain.

He returned to Cincinnati in 1960 and went to work for his new father-in-law (the late Charles H. Klein) in the printing business. In 1983 they bought a small family-run business, Topicz, which he led to becoming a strong, respected, privately held company in Cincinnati and throughout the Midwest.

Marvin enjoyed tennis, golf and especially sailing. He named his boat Machbuster which he sailed in Maine and throughout the Caribbean and the British Virgin Islands. He was a member of YPO (Young President's Organization), Losantiville Country Club, The Queen City Club and The Arundel Golf Club (Kennebunkport, Maine).

He leaves his beloved wife of 61 years, Betsy K (nee Klein), daughter, Melissa S. Greenberg (Missy), son Marvin H. Jr (Chip), grandson Adam B. Greenberg, granddaughter Rachael A. Greenberg and brother Ben H. Schwartz.

Funeral services will be held at Weil Kahn Funeral Home, 8350 Cornell Road on Sunday, April 3rd at 2pm. The family will receive guests before the service beginning at 1pm. Burial will immediately follow the funeral service at United Jewish Cemetery, 3400 Montgomery Road. “ I first met Marvin 12 years ago when I came to Topicz to interview for a position. I didn't know anything about the company and had just finished speaking with the general manager when I was told the owner of the company wanted to meet with me. This was a first on my part as I came from a corporate world where the "owners" were never seen--I was prepared to be intimidated. Much to my surprise in came a grandfatherly looking gentlemen who immediately put me at ease and sat down for a chat not just about my work experience but about me the person. This would be the beginning of hundreds of "chats" throughout the next 12 years as I came to be employed at Topicz. He made us feel like we were a part of something and that he appreciated us for what we did throughout the year. I will miss him both personally and professionally.
