Morris was raised in Brooklyn. After serving honorably in Vietnam, Morris was a successful traveling menswear salesman. He left the road to spend more time with his family. He co-founded Rascal's NY Deli to bring delicious deli food to Cincinnati. Morris was an avid and astute investor and loved to speak on his latest success. Morris loved to work and his jovial and personable demeanor made him many friends.
