I have worked with Paul since 1998 but we were friends and it never seemed like work because we enjoyed each others company. When I think of Paul I think about how much he loved his family and how proud of them he was. I think about his dry witty sense of humor, his laugh, his sarcasm, his love of reading and history. I was always amazed at how people would contact him years later because they took a new job somewhere else and wanted to work with him again. That normally happens to most of us a few times in our career but that occurred pretty regularly with Paul because he was very highly thought of and well respected. A few years ago I was suddenly ill and Paul stepped in and helped my wife deal with the companies I represent (I am a manufacturers rep).

Paul also contacted my companies and updated them and politely told them that if they did not stand by me he would never buy anything from them again. Paul never mentioned that but a few of my companies mentioned it. I remember waking up in my hospital room early one morning and there was my friend Paul sitting in a chair in the dark. I was lucky to be able to spend a lot of time with my friend away from work as well.
