Roslyn Beatrice Reich was born in Bridgeport, CT to Sol and Pearl Reich. Her family moved to Yardley, PA and then Cincinnati, where she graduated from Finneytown HS in 1963. She attended OSU for a year and then transferred to art school in Cincinnati, where she studied painting, drawing, and graphic design. She worked in marketing for several Cincinnati companies including General Electric, Zomox, and Michelman, Inc.

For five decades, she was a dedicated member of Tri-State Volunteers, formerly known as the Up Downtowners. She served as president of the board and volunteered for numerous races, festivals, and other charity events.

Favorite events included the Flying Pig Marathon, the Queen Bee, and Tall Stacks. She created marketing materials, recruited other volunteers, and wrote the newsletter.

She loved animals and had several cats as pets. She was a softball player and swimmer and enjoyed traveling, vintage TV shows, and supporting the Reds and Bengals. She will be remembered for her creativity and ability to make friends everywhere she went.

Ros is survived by her sister, Susan Katz, niece Lori Myers (Charles), and nephew David Katz (Gayle Bessenoff), as well as cousins Robert, Roberta, Ilene, and Roseanne and an abundance of friends.
