He served in many roles that kept him close to books and education throughout his life. He was Assistant Curator at the Cincinnati Historical Society, he was a part-time librarian at Hebrew Union College, and for many years he volunteered at the

Cincinnati Public Library. His nieces and nephews have fond memories of the many books he gifted them as they were growing up.
