

Theodore W. Striker

January 31, 1936 - October 17, 2021

STRIKER, Theodore W., age 85, passed away October 17, 2021, caring son of the late Delia and Cecil Striker, loving and beloved husband of Carol (Bamberger) Striker, adored father of Robert (Patrice Tetta) Striker and Laura Striker, devoted grandfather of Eli and Noah Striker, and dear brother of Cecil Lee (Ute) Striker. Ted was a graduate of Walnut Hills High School, Dartmouth College, and the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine. He had a 50-year career at Cincinnati Children's Hospital as an innovator in the specialty of pediatric anesthesia. Under his leadership that department developed into one with an outstanding national reputation. Ted was also a founder and/or leader of many pediatric anesthesia organizations. The love of classical music led Ted to the chairmanship of the board of WGUC. He was also a longtime board member of the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra and a member of the Literary Club. A private service will be held. 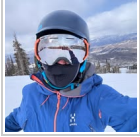
